

	Zero Trust Architecture – Apply strict access controls and user authentication across your print environment.

	Automated Scan Workflows – Streamline document capture and routing with one-touch, customizable scanning.			
	Al-Driven Data Extraction — Enables intelligent capture workflows for faster, more accurate processing.			
	Cloud and Third-Party Integrations – Connect to Microsoft 365, Google Workspace, Universal Print, and leading card reader systems for a seamless print experience.			
	Analytics and Reporting			
	Usage Tracking – Monitor print activity and supply consumption trends.			
	Cost Allocation – Track print spend by team, department, or project.			
	Audit Trails and Compliance – Track user activity and document workflows to support regulatory audits and internal oversight.
